

# Summary of poll results:

“Should Mike Moan receive a 7% pay increase?”

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## Poll Preamble:

On May 10th, the D200 Board approved an early contract extension and 7% increase in pay for Superintendent Mike Moan. Given that residents of the school district pay among the highest taxes in the country, that this district accounts for nearly 70% of the resident's property taxes and that the projection for salary increases in 2016 was just 3%, this seems excessive and unnecessary.

Furthermore, D200 Administrative Staff average pay already exceeds state average for administrators while D200 scored a 25.5% rating for college and career readiness (compared to the state average score of 33.0%.)

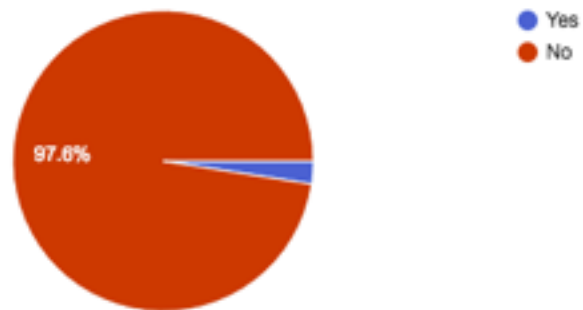
